Visual arts You gotta have art

Want to get interactive with the visual arts? Try out this year's ArtHouse, an annual event at the **Institute of Contemporary Art** in downtown San Jose (560 S. First St.). Saturday and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., the institute is opening its doors not only to show

off its current exhibitions but also to offer art-making, art works for sale, talks by artists, programs, tours and various demonstrations. Included are the institute's Print Fair, a sale of works by 35 Bay Area printmakers; Printapalooza! (morning and afternoon art-making workshops at the Print Center); and lunchtime lectures and demos by artists currently in residence at the museum. If you
